Lost your driver's licence due to a drink driving offence?

If you wish to **re-licence** in the Northern Territory, you are required by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles, to successfully complete an approved drink driver education course.

Which course?

You need to complete the Short Course in Drink Driver Education.

The Course in Drink Driver Education consists of 2 Modules - **Module UGS002 & Module UGS003**

How many modules do I need to do?

If this is your *first* drink driving offence *and* your blood alcohol concentration (BAC) was recorded at less than 0.15%, you are required to complete **Module UGS002** to regain a driver's licence in the NT.

Module UGS002 consists of five x 2 hour sessions (10 hours). The topics covered:

1. Identify factors that influence the level of blood alcohol concentration
2. Identify risk levels of drinking
3. Identify the acute effects of alcohol on body functions
4. Recognise individual and community problems associated with drinking
5. Identify individual and environmental factors that influence drinking behaviour
6. Develop an understanding of the law relating to drink driving
7. Develop personal plans to avoid drinking and driving

If this is *more* than your first offence, *or* you recorded a BAC of 0.15% or higher, *or* you were charged with refusing to supply a breath sample, you are required to complete **Modules Module UGS002 and Module UGS 003** in order to regain a driver's licence in the NT.

Module 2 (UGS003) consists of two x 2 hour sessions (4 hours). This module looks at:

1. Self-monitor the level and pattern of alcohol consumption
2. Identify long-term effects of alcohol consumption
3. Identify the interaction between lifestyle and alcohol consumption
4. Develop personal strategies to control drinking

Check with the Motor Vehicle Registry for information about which modules you need to do.

How do I book into the course?

Contact Amity Community Services on 89446500 to make an appointment for an **enrolment interview**, at which time the requirements of the course will be explained.

You will need to:

- allow **20 minutes** for the enrolment interview
- provide **2 forms of identification** at the time of enrolment
- agree to the conditions of the course
- pay your **course fee**

How much do I pay? (fee includes 10% GST)

- **Module UGO 033** = \$200.00
- **Module UGO 033 & Module UGO 034** = \$280.00

OTHER INFORMATION:

Where English is a Second Language -

The course is delivered in English. If English is not the first language used by a course participant, then interpreting services can be used for the enrolment interview. Further interpreting support needed for participation in and completion of the course can be discussed at the enrolment.

Conditions when you attend the course-

Conditions which apply to all participants during the course will be discussed with you at the enrolment interview. You will be asked to sign a contract to show that you understand, and agree to attend with these conditions.

The Notification of Completion Certificate -

The Notification of Completion Certificate is given to you at the end of the course, after you have been assessed as having gained the required skills and knowledge outlined in the course. Motor Vehicle Registry (NT) requires you to present this at the time you relicense.

Assessment -

Each 2 hour session has a set of learning outcomes. You are assessed for competency in these learning outcomes by the course trainer at the end of each session. Assessments can be conducted in writing or verbally.

If needed, a session may be repeated up to 3 times in order to achieve the learning outcome(s), at no extra cost. Where learning outcomes have not been achieved after 3 attempts, the participant and course trainer can then discuss possible options.

If you have already completed a drink driving course -

You can apply for recognition of prior learning, if:

* You have completed a similar course interstate, have not re-offended and you are seeking to re-license in the Northern Territory.

NOTE - Persons who have previously attended a Drink Driver Education course, re-license and subsequently re-offend will not be granted 'recognition of prior learning' as it is considered that a further drinking driving offence is an indication that the competencies have not been retained.

Refunds -

Refunds are granted only if you decide not to commence the Course. Withdrawal from the Course after you have commenced, cancels any entitlement to a refund.

Complaints -

Procedures to deal with complaints are designed to resolve differences in a fair and friendly manner. If the trainer is unable to deal with a complaint to the satisfaction of the participant, arrangements can be made for the matter to be discussed with the Chief Executive Officer of the Organization.
